Focus on a Community where neighbors turn to each other in times of need and in times of celebration. When there is a big Snowstorm, neighbors check on each other to make sure everyone is okay, or when a High School student graduates, everyone turns out to celebrate.

Got the Picture?

Taking part in your Neighborhood Watch Program creates a sense of Community. This also creates a close-knit neighborhood which reduces your chance of becoming a victim of crime.

Why does it Work?

Good neighbors look out for each other. They keep a close eye on each others children, vehicles, and homes. Through a strong Neighborhood Watch Program within your Community, suspicious activities are reported and crimes are often stopped before they happen.

How to Get Started!

#1 Step One:

Form a small group of neighbors to discuss the idea of starting up a Neighborhood Watch Program within your Community.

#2 Step Two:

Recruit volunteers for positions:

- Two Community Coordinators
- One or more Lead Block Captains
- Several Block Captains

#3 Step Three:

- Establish a Phone Tree and E-mail Directory for each Block or Section
- Encourage residents to signup and become involved, such benefits include:

- Crime Alerts released by the Erie Police Department.

- Annual Block Parties hosted on the National Night Out Event

#4 Step Four:

Contact the Erie Police Department to speak with an Officer to schedule a kickoff meeting at **303-926-2800**
